

SHORT EXCERPT OF THE ORDINANCE ON THE GENERAL PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT AND GATHERING OF PEOPLE IN PUBLIC PLACES AND SURFACES IN THE REPUBLIC OF SLOVENIA

We would like to inform you that the Government of the Republic of Slovenia on April 29 2020, in order to contain and control the SARS CoV-2 (COVID 19) pandemic, adopted the “[Ordinance on the general prohibition of movement and gathering of people in public spaces, surfaces, and places in the Republic of Slovenia](#)” (hereinafter referred to as the Ordinance). The Ordinance applies from 30 April 2020.

Therefore, this Ordinance eliminates the prohibition of movement outside the municipality of permanent or temporary residence for services or goods permitted by the existing ordinance and will be subject to further release measures.

This Ordinance still temporarily prohibits the movement and gathering of people in public places and areas in the Republic of Slovenia in order to contain and control the COVID-19 epidemic and prohibits access to public places and areas in the Republic of Slovenia, unless otherwise specified by this or another governmental ordinance. The Ordinance stipulates the release of movement or access to other services in Slovenia if the government accepts or abolishes the temporary ban on offering and selling goods and services directly to consumers.

The prohibition of movement, access, and retention on a public place is still in force; but within the scope of the exceptions to the ordinance, movement is permitted:

- to groups of persons, in the case of immediate family members or members of a common household, and if possible a safe distance between the similar groups or individuals must be maintained,
- to groups of co-workers up to a maximum of five people if they use shared passenger transportation to or from work or are called upon to perform tasks under the scope of Civil Protection.

Please note that when moving and being in a closed public space, where the services that are allowed by the Ordinance are provided, care must be taken to maintain a safe distance from other persons and it is mandatory to use a protective mask or other forms of protection of the oral and nasal area (scarf, bandana or similar protection that covers nose and mouth), disinfection of hands is also mandatory. The disinfectant must be provided by the service provider.

The Government will continue to determine the professional merits of the measures referred to in this Ordinance at least every seven days and decide on whether these measures should also be applied in the future or not. The public will be informed accordingly.
